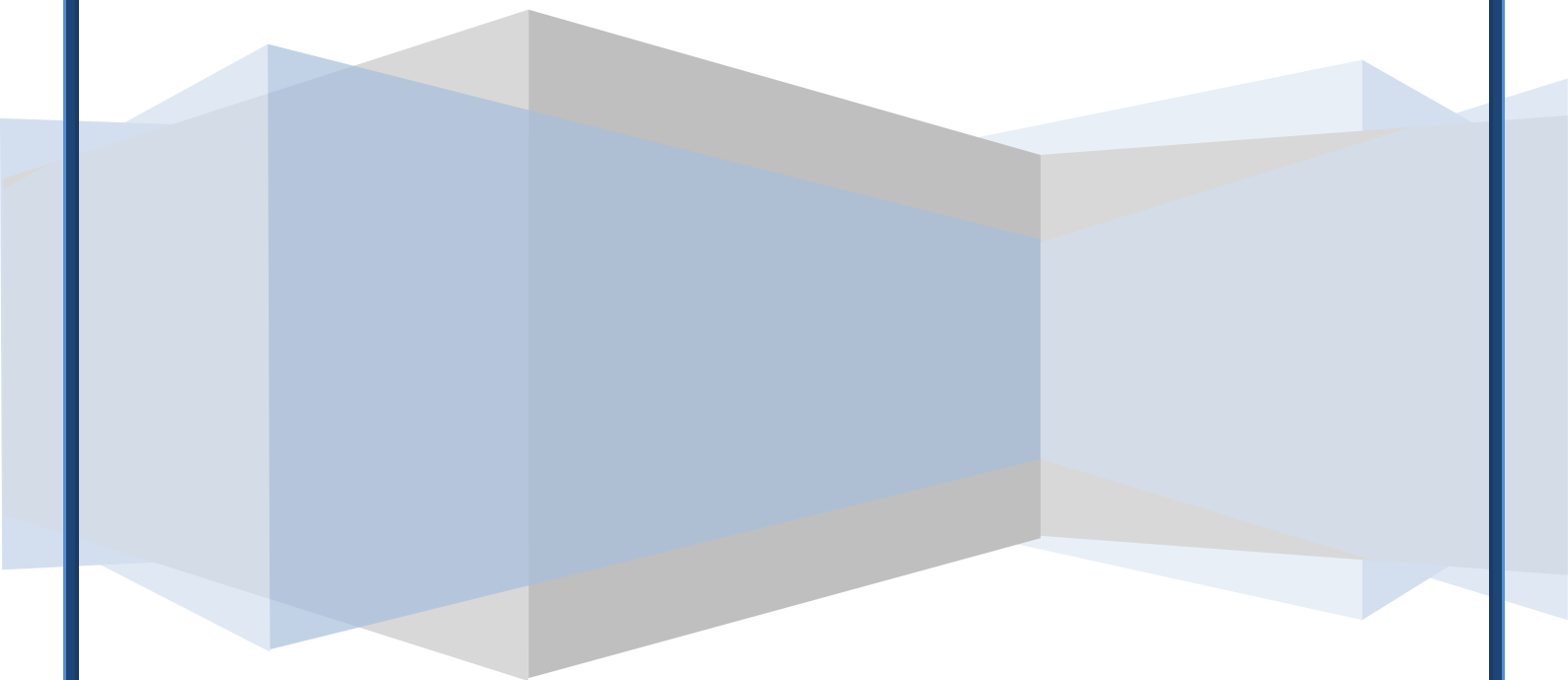




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Traffic Management for Community Events

Duration: 1 Days Classroom training.

Group Size: Maximum 12 delegates.

Who should attend: This training is aimed at event organisers or individuals that have responsibility for traffic management for organised events working in conjunction with the local Highway Authority, the police and other authorities and persons as appropriate.

This course is intended for event stewards, whose duties may include guiding vehicles, maintaining emergency routes, erecting signs and notices, dealing with pedestrian control, etc.

The course is not intended for traffic marshals who are appointed and accredited by the police to deal with more complex traffic management issues at major events.

The aim of this course: To familiarise learners with all traffic management requirements related to community events, such as carnivals and sporting events, and to give attendees an understanding of how to create a Traffic Management Plan.

Give learners an awareness of issues affecting traffic, pedestrian and event staff safety. Events promoters should be aware that their event may require licensing or consent from Planning and/or Environmental Health.

Course Objectives:

On completion of the session delegates will:-

- Be aware of current legislation and its requirements.
- Understand the application process and costs involved.
- Be able to devise a Traffic Management Plan.
- Be able to identify typical hazards and appropriate control measures related to the activity.
- Understand basic traffic management requirements affecting highway users and event staff.
- Demonstrate by examination sufficient knowledge to be accredited as a steward for this activity.

Registration: On successful completion of the training the candidates will receive a Traffic Management Community Events Card which is valid for 5 years.
